Again, I am always amazed at the ability and willingness of the members of our guild. There are truly angels amongst us.

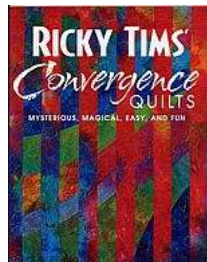

Recipe of the Month - April

I got the recipe out of a cookbook written by Cecilia Ludwig who lived here for several years and has family still in the area. She and her husband owned and operated a restaurant between here and St. George for several years and after they closed it, they opened one in Cedar City. When we first moved here, we ate there a few times. My mother is from German stock. She was raised in Wisconsin where there are a lot of German families. I love much of the German food. I especially like spare ribs and sauerkraut. We ate it often when I was growing up.

Cecelia Ludwig's German Potato Salad

4 pounds potatoes
8 slices bacon, chopped
1/4 cup flour
3 cups water
1/2 teaspoon pepper
2 tablespoons salt
1/2 cup cider vinegar
2 tablespoons sugar
1 large onion, sliced in rings

Boil potatoes with the skin on, let cool then peel and slice. Make sauce by putting finely chopped bacon in a skillet or heavy pan and brown. Add flour then brown lightly. Add water, pepper, salt, vinegar, sugar and onion. Simmer this for 10-15 minutes.

Add potatoes and serve warm in double boiler or crock pot. It will keep for a whole day. It improves the flavor by letting it set for a couple of hours.

My addition to the recipe:
I made the salad the night before guild, put it in a baking pan and covered it with foil. In the morning, I baked it covered with foil for about 25 minutes to re-warm it.
