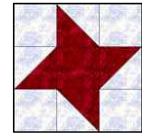
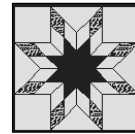
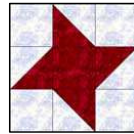


If you feel overwhelmed by your quilt scraps and extra quilt pieces, but you can't quite throw them out, then check out Bonnie Hunter's website at: [www.quiltville.com](http://www.quiltville.com) and read up on her stash busters tips. She has tips to help you organize your quilt scraps so they are usable for scrap quilts.

Remember: your quilt scraps cost you just as much as your full yardage did. If you paid \$9.00 a yard for your quilt fabric, you paid \$9.00 a yard for the leftovers too!

### Cheese Ball

2 (8 oz) packages cream cheese  
1/2 cup grated cheddar cheese  
1 packet dry buttermilk ranch dressing mix  
4 green onions, chopped  
1/4 cup chopped black olives  
5 pieces of bacon, fried crisp & crumbled  
chopped pecans

Mix cream cheese and dry ranch packet until smooth. Mix in grated cheese, green onion, olives and bacon. Form into a ball. Crust with chopped pecans.  
Chill and serve with you favorite crackers or chips.

### Chocolate Eclair Torte

**1 cup water**  
**1 cup flour**  
**1/2 cup butter**  
**4 eggs**

Bring water and butter to a boil. Add flour and beat until smooth and a ball forms.  
Remove from heat. Cool 10 minutes. Add eggs, one at a time, mix well after each one.  
Spread on greased jelly roll pan. Bake @ 400 degrees for 25 - 30 minutes.  
When cool, press down and fill.

**Filling:**

2 small packages instant vanilla pudding mix.  
 2-1/2 cups milk  
 1 teaspoon vanilla  
 1 - 8 oz pkg. cool whip

Mix pudding, milk and vanilla together until thick. Add Cool Whip. Pour over crust and chill. When set, frost.

**Frosting:**

1/2 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips  
 1-1/2 tablespoons butter  
 1 tablespoon milk

Melt over low heat Drizzle over filling.

Quilts – General Guidelines

These quilts are going to people who are in need of help. Quality is more important than quantity. Remember this from the beginning when selecting fabrics all the way to the end when finishing the quilt.

Cotton, blend or flannel is best. Denim or 8 oz Bonded poly batting or cotton batting. 3 or 4 ply yarn should be used for tying. Use double thread of the 3 or 4 ply yarn. When making the quilt top the seams need to be 1/2" not 1/4" like we are used to. Ties should be approximately 4 inches apart, and the stitch on the bottom should be 1/4" to 1/2"; smaller than that can pull through. Square knot or international stitch is preferred. Binding – Can be done by hand or machine. It can be done by using a 2 1/4 - 2 1/2 strip, folded in half and sewn on or you can use the pillowcase method (this method can be used for tying without frames)., With right sides together, lay top and bottom of quilt on flat surface. Lay batting on top, pin and sew three sides. Turn right side out and fold in the open end. Top-stitch around four edges! Sew another row 1" from the edges to secure batting then tie the quilt.
