After retiring from that job in 1991, they moved to Mineola, Texas where she began quilting by taking her first class - learning how to do a log cabin quilt using a serger sewing machine. She subsequently joined the Mineola League of the Arts, where she made quilting friends, took classes and became an accomplished quilter, She taught quilting classes, including AFlower Pounding and entered numerous quilt shows in which she won awards and ribbons (none of which she can find now she says). One of her favorite memories is of taking a bus on a road trip to 3 different quilt shops in different towns in her area, where each shop gave out door prizes, had specials and one even a scavenger hunt. She liked to shop at Stitchin-Heaven in Quitman, TX and going to Calico Cupboard in Colleyville, TX with her daughter Diane, who is also an accomplished quilter and has had one of her art quilts published in a book..

Upon moving to Cedar City in 2004, she joined the quilt guild and continued to make good friends, take and teach classes and is still waiting for her next quilting road trip.

### *“Label of Love”*

Consider labeling each quilt you make. A label is a record that will provide valuable information for future generations. It can be pieced, stamped, or computer generated and printed. It is the best way to connect the quilt to the quilt maker. Consider including who made the quilt, the date, the size, the recipient, occasion for giving the quilt and the quilt name or pattern information.

## Favorite Recipe

### Classic Coffeecake

Bake 45 minutes      350 degrees

- 1 C. Butter, softened
- 1 ½ C. Sugar
- 2 Eggs
- 1 ½ tsp. Vanilla
- 2 C. Flour
- 1 tsp. Baking Powder
- 1 tsp. Baking Soda
- 1 C. Sour Cream

Preheat oven to 350, butter a 9 x 13 baking pan.

Cream butter. Gradually add sugar, eggs & vanilla.

Mix flour, baking powder, & baking soda.

Add flour mixture alternately with sourcream to creamed mixture, pour into buttered pan.

Top with B. Sugar/sugar/cinnamon/nut mix.

#### Top with:

- ¼ C. Brown Sugar
- 2 Tbsp. Sugar
- ½ tsp. Cinnamon
- ¼ C. chopped Walnuts
