Chocolate Croissant Bread Pudding

- 4 large or 6 medium croissants cut into 1 inch cubes
- 5 Tablespoons softened butter, divided
- 2 cups half & half
- 6 oz squares of semi sweet chocolate
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 2/3 cups sugar
- 3 eggs

Spread croissant cubes on baking sheet. Bake until lightly toasted; Spread one Tbls. butter in bottom of 8 or 9" baking dish, add toasted croissant cubes. Heat 1/2 & 1/2 & remaining butter until almost boiling. Whisk in melted choc. & vanilla, let cool 10 min. Whisk together sugar and eggs & then slowly whisk in the chocolate mixture. Pour over croissant cubes, making sure all are coated. Let stand 1 hour. Bake 35 min. 350 degrees.

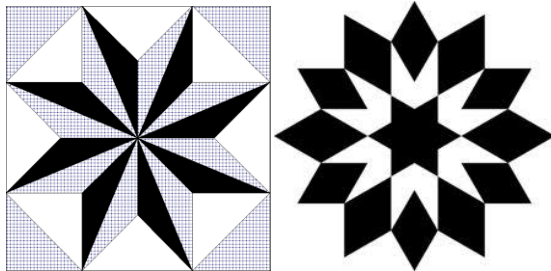
