Sweatshirt Jacket

Teacher: Cherri DelGado

Long sleeved, set in sleeve, 1-2 sizes bigger than normal size
1-1/2 yds 35" fabric, if doing front & back different, 3/4 yds ea.
1/2 yd for binding (can be 2nd or 3rd color)
Washable marking chalk, pencil or was
Pins &/or Spray and Fix (505)
Ruler 1-1/2-2" wide if quilting in straight line
Walking foot
Basic Sewing kit & machine
*If preferred, piece fabric for front & back rather than a solid piece.

Preparing shirt & fabric:

1. Wash & dry sweatshirt & fabric
2. Cut sweatshirt apart.
Cut the sleeves along seam, discard.
Cut out shoulder seams
Cut outside seams or along fold
If desired, cut off cuffs, neck band & bottom of shirt.

Stack & Whack

Teacher: Sheryl Lewis

The Stack & Whack quilt is a fun and easy quilt to make, the key to success is the fabric selection.

~100% cotton

Large floral and leaf prints with many colors, abstract prints and ethnic designs, geometrics.

Prints should be in a medium to large scale design.

A variety of contrasts, lines and shapes in the print.

Fabric amount is determined by the size of quilt and the repeat of design of print. To determine the repeat, measure between the repeated designs from selvage to selvage.

Throw	7-10"	11-14"	15-20"	21-27"
	2 1/2 yds	3 1/2 yds	5 yds	6 3/4 yd
Queen	6 yds	6 yds	6 1/2 yds	6 3/4

Background Throw: 3 yards
Queen: 4 3/4 yards

Advice from a 1949 Singer Sewing Manual



Advice from a Singer Sewing Manual from 1949:

Prepare yourself mentally for sewing. Think about what you are going to do. . . never approach sewing with a sigh or lackadaisically. Good results are difficult when indifference predominates. Never try to sew with a sink full of dirty dishes or beds unmade. When there are urgent housekeeping chores, do these first so your mind is free to enjoy your sewing. . .When you sew, make yourself as attractive as possible. Put on a clean dress. Keep a little bag full of French chalk near your sewing machine to dust your fingers at intervals. Have your hair in order, powder and lipstick put on . . . [If] you are constantly fearful that a visitor will drop in or your husband will come home and you will not look neatly put together, you will not enjoy your sewing as you should. .
