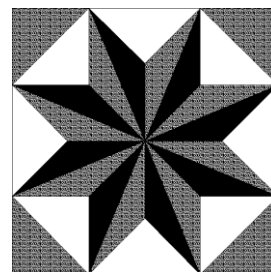

**Mary Ruggles' Cabbage Stroganoff
Serves 6 to 8 servings.**

1 c chopped green onions
1 lb ground beef or ground turkey
1 small head of green cabbage, chopped coarsely
1 c water, divided
1 pkg. (1.37 oz) Lipton's onion soup mix
1 can (10 1/2 oz) cream of mushroom soup, undiluted
1 c sour cream
Mashed potatoes or noodles if desired

In large pan add cabbage, 3/4 c water, crumbled cooked meat and
simmer over med. heat until cabbage is wilted.
Sprinkle with onion soup mix, mix thoroughly.
Add mushroom soup, rinse can with remaining water and add
water. Stir in sour cream, cover and simmer over low heat till
tender makes 6 to 8 servings.
